Genuine "Gospel" Goodness

Matt. 5:20

- I. The <u>Kingdom</u> of God: Jesus is talking to poor, desperate masses and His 12 disciples.
 - A. The Beatitudes show an **upside-down** kingdom in its *values*—<u>distinct from the world</u>
 - B. The Rest of the Sermon shows an **inside-out** kingdom in *ethics*—<u>distinct from religion</u>

Read text (v.20) and PRAY

- II. READ it in Context (v.17-20)
 - Jesus talks about OT Law (v.17-19)—FULFILLED and PERPETUAL—Craig C.
 - Jesus has *fulfilled* the Law for us—obeyed its precepts, satisfied its penalties

*** However, this paragraph is about how Christians are also to practically obey the Law! ***

How will you keep the Law (not "if")?—CHOOSE: 2 ways, 2 trees, 2 foundations—Tim Keller

- Will you keep the Law like the scribes and Pharisees?—religious leaders
- What is a *scribe*?—seminary professors, professional bible teachers
- What is a *Pharisee*?—"separate:" monks, nuns, Amish, professional law-keepers

<u>Martin Lloyd-Jones:</u> "The trouble with the Pharisees was that they were interested in details rather than principles, in actions rather than motives, in doing rather than being."

- The rest of the Sermon shows how it looks for our righteousness to exceed theirs:
 - o Gospel believers should handle anger better than the Pharisees
 - We handle lust better
 - We handle **matters of justice** better (an eye for an eye . . .)
 - We handle **conflict** better (*love your enemy*)
 - We handle **marriage** better
 - We handle **charity** better (don't let your left hand know what your right is doing)
 - We handle prayer better
 - We handle fasting better
 - We handle **money** better (*you cannot serve God and money*)
 - We handle **anxiety** better (tomorrow will worry about itself)
 - We handle **judgment** better than the Pharisees
 - Our **reward** from God is better than that of the Pharisees

- **Jesus doesn't demand *less* righteousness, but perfect, God-like goodness (5:48)—HOW???
- 2 Kinds of Righteousness: hollow obedience ("scribes and Pharisees") and heartfelt ("you").
- III. The Righteousness We Reject—Jesus on the Temple Mount: READ Matt. 23:1-33
 - **HOLLOW** righteousness makes us **look like** this: 12 images Jesus uses:
 - 1. Actors—hypocrites
 - 2. Judges—"they sit on Moses's seat"
 - 3. Taskmasters—load people with burdens hard to bear
 - 4. Gatekeepers—shut the kingdom of heaven in people's faces!
 - 5. Pompous Clergymen (phylacteries, fringes, "rabbi, teacher, scribe," titles)
 - 6. Blind Guides
 - 7. Nit-pickers (strain out the littlest gnats!!!)
 - 8. Camel-swallowers—*absurd* to an onlooker
 - 9. Filthy cups (crusty *spittoons*)
 - 10. Whitewashed tombs
 - 11. Poisonous Vipers
 - 12. Children of hell

- The pursuit of **HOLLOW** righteousness renders you: disgusting to God and empty inside
 - 1. Hypocritical
 - 2. Exclusive
 - 3. Obsessive
 - 4. Vain

- 5. Materialistic (the gift over the altar)
- 6. Near-sighted
- 7. Deceitful
- 8. Boastful

Hollow righteousness burdens you and tells you to be someone you're not. No joy in this.

BUT... Keeping up the act is exhausting. Wearing a mask isolates you. Checking off the list is tedious. Going through the motions burns you out. Hollow righteousness leaves you **empty**.

Jesus lifts your burdens, then tells you to be yourself! It's inside-out righteousness.

- Everything you hate about empty religion, Jesus also hates, because He is **JOY!**
- Jesus wants to free you, by His love, from the **burden** of pride or fear-driven obedience

[&]quot;Don't be that guy." The appearance of godliness, but denying its power—2 Tim. 3:5

- IV. The Righteousness We Receive—Justification and New Birth
 - 1. A new legal standing: *forgiving* real guilt & *crediting* real obedience
- 2 Cor. 5:21: For our sake, He (God) made Him (Jesus) to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the **righteousness** of God.
- Rom. 3:28: For we hold that one is **justified** by faith apart from works of the law.
- Rom. 4:5: And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as **righteousness**
- Rom. 10:4: For Christ is the end of the law for **righteousness** to everyone who believes.
 - The new man "fulfills the Law" in a legal verdict: JUSTIFIED!
 - 2. A new human nature—"born again"
- Eph. 4:22-24: Put off your *old self*, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and [be] renewed in the spirit of your minds, and [put on] the *new self*, created after the likeness of God **in true righteousness** and holiness.
- Rom. 6:17-18: But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become *obedient from the heart* to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of **righteousness**.
- 1 John 3:9: No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for *God's seed abides in him*; and he cannot keep on sinning, because he has been born of God.
 - The new man "fulfills the Law" in our liberated life (daily love to God and man)
- V. The Righteousness We Radiate—"Progressive Sanctification"
 - The Person and Essence of God dwell in you now!
 - God is light. God is love.
 - Light and love radiate outwards to touch the world and declare themselves!
 - Be who you are!
- Matt. 5:14-15: You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden.
- Matt. 13:43: Then the righteous will **shine** like the sun in the kingdom of their Father.

- VI. The <u>Resource</u> for Righteousness: the Spirit of Jesus within all **believers**
 - We have a **new** relationship with God, a **new** covenant agreement with Him.

Ezek. 36:26-27: I will give you *a new hea*rt, and a *new spirit* I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put **my Spirit** within you, and **cause you to walk** in my statutes **and be careful to obey** my rules.

• God the Spirit walks with us in relationship, **helping** us keep the Law of God!!!

Phil. 2:12-13: *Work out* your own salvation with fear and trembling, for <u>it is God who works in</u> you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Gal. 5:16: But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

- The presence of Jesus creates contented friendship
- The **revelation** of Jesus awakens **gratitude**—"demands my soul, my life, my all"
- The love of Jesus sweetens our obedience—"compels us"
- The **power** of Jesus enables our **service**

How do we tap this Resource?

i. **Enjoy** a daily relationship with God. **Hear** His Word. **Walk** with Him consistently.

William Temple: "Religion is what a man does with his solitude."

VII. <u>Applications</u>

- 1. RECEIVE legal **verdict** of "righteous": repent and believe in Jesus Christ today!
- 2. BELIEVE in your new *identity* and new-birth *nature*:
 - Forgiven
 - Loved
 - Worthy
 - Connected
 - Useful—to God and others
- 3. **BE** who you are—consistent obedience

1 Cor. 5:7: Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are.

- 4. Invite God's Spirit into your life through daily relationship in His Word!
- 5. **Teach** others to radiate the righteousness of God (aka "do the commandments).
 - "Do them and *teach* them"—Matt. 5:19
