

Christ the Head of the Church His Body

Col 2:19 and not holding fast to the **Head**, from whom all the body, nourished and knit together by joints and ligaments, grows with the increase *that is* from God.

Eph 1:22 And He put all *things* under His feet, and gave Him *to be* **head** over all *things* to the church, **Eph 5:23** as also Christ is **head** of the church; and He is the Savior of the body.

Eph 5:29 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord *does* the church.

plérōma, play'-ro-mah; repletion or completion, i.e. (subjectively) what fills (as contents, supplement, copiousness, multitude), or (objectively) what is filled (as container, performance, period):—which is put in to fill up, piece that filled up, fulfilling, full, fulness.

Paul doubles down by saying ALL the FULLNESS

What does it mean to be Reconciled?

To Reconcile: to reconcile back again. To bring back to a state of harmony

Why is there disharmony?

Our sin has separated us from God. Isaiah 59:1-8

Wages of our sin is death. Rom 6:23

Wrath lays upon us. John 3:36

We are building up wrath. Rom 2:5

God's wrath is coming upon the sons of disobedience Eph 5:6, Col 3:6

How can we be reconciled?

We have been brought near. Eph 2:13

Forgiveness of sins. Eph 1:7

Saved from wrath. Rom 5:9

We have been purchased. Acts 20:28

Only by the blood can we have peace. Col 1:20

Redeemed by the blood. 1 Peter 1:18,19

We are washed by the blood. 1John 1:7, Rev 1:5

We are overcomers by the blood. Rev 12:11
